
Perpendicular Bisector Theorem

If a point is on the perpendicular bisector of a segment, then it is equidistant from the endpoints of the segment.


PROOF: SEE EXAMPLE 2.

Then... PX = PY


How can you find points that are equidistant from the endpoints of \overline{AB} ? What do you notice about these points and their relationship with \overline{AB} ?



Converse of the Perpendicular Bisector Theorem

If a point is equidistant from the endpoints of a segment, then it is on the perpendicular bisector of the segment.

PROOF: SEE EXAMPLE 2 TRY IT.




Then... XQ = YQ and $\overrightarrow{PQ} \perp \overline{XY}$

$$6x-10 = 3x+2$$




$$AD = 3 \times +2$$




Angle Bisector Theorem

If a point is on the bisector of an angle, then it is equidistant from the two sides of the angle.




If $\angle XWY \cong \angle ZWY$ and XY = 4, what is YZ? Enter your answer


