Community

Central High School is located in Grand Junction, Colorado. Grand Junction serves as the hub of business and recreational activities on the western slope of the Colorado Rockies, about 250 miles west across the mountains from Denver. Grand Junction is the largest city between Denver and Salt Lake on the I-70 corridor, making it the regional business and commerce hub. It is the county seat with an area population over 130,000. Situated 4600 feet above sea level at the junction of the Gunnison and Colorado Rivers, it is a fruit-producing oasis surrounded by Grand Mesa (the world's largest flat top mountain), the Bookcliffs, the Colorado National Monument, and the Uncompangre range.

Schedule

Central is operating on a 4 X 4 block schedule, in which students have 4 classes and an advisory every quarter. Prior to the 20-21 school year, Central was on a semester system in which students had 8 classes per 18 week semesters. However, due to COVID, we switched classes for the 20-21 school year back to a 4X4 block so that students might be able to concentrate more fully on 4 classes at a time in the event of switching from in-person learning to remote learning. Thus, students will earn two credits at the end of each 9 week quarter, totaling the potential of earning 8 credits per year.

Graduation Requirements

Students must meet the following criteria in order to earn a diploma:

- Earn 25 credits in standards-based approved courses
- Earn a 2.0 or better cumulative G.P.A.
- Students must meet state proficiency requirements

Academic Schedule and Curriculum

Students have the opportunity to enroll in 8 year long credits. All students are also enrolled in an advisory class for all four years. Typically, the school year is divided into two eighteen week semesters. However, due to COVID, we have switched classes back to a 4X4 block so that students might be able to concentrate more fully on 4 classes at a time in the event of switching from in-person learning to remote learning. Thus, students will earn two credits at the end of each 9 week quarter, totaling the potential of earning 8 credits per year.

STEM and Enrichment Opportunities

Designed to provide relevancy and challenge for all students, <u>Central High School is the first Nationally Certified STEM High School in Colorado</u>. Students in the STEM Program have a variety of pathways available to them including four year college preparatory pathways, career and technical pathways, military pathways, and PTECH (Pathways in Technology Early College High School) pathways (Associate's Degrees options in: manufacturing, welding, mechanical engineering technology, and mechatronics.) 25% of the school's faculty have become STEM certified through the National Institute of STEM Education, and our school is working to move from a program to STEM FOR ALL students. Concurrent enrollment courses through Western Colorado Community College and Colorado Mesa University are available to all student, and Central High School offers English 111, 112, Chemistry 121, Chemistry 131, Math 108, and Math 113 on campus taught by approved instructors; Career Center courses are available to students in grades 9-12 to explore a variety of vocations such as automotive, horticulture, culinary, medical careers, and small animal care; Career Wise Internships are available to all students grades 10-12; JROTC is available to all students, in grades 9-12.

Advanced Placement

Advanced Placement courses are open to all students, grades 9-12 and are offered in the following subjects: English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Statistics, Calculus AB/BC, US History, US Government and Politics, Human Geography, Chemistry, Biology, Physics, Environmental Science, Spanish Language, and Computer Science Principles. Honors courses are available for students in the 9th and 10th grade levels in English Composition, Biology, and Geometry and Algebra 2.
